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

Proficiency Levels on Science State Assessments





UCOA RESOURCE ALLOCATION DASHBOARDS (2022-2023)


This set of interactive dashboards allows users to explore how Local Education Agencies (LEAs) allocate resources between the schools in the LEA. For LEAs with just one school, it allows users to compare with other LEAs with only one school. The first dashboard examines whether LEAs allocate resources progressively, that is, whether schools with larger share of disadvantaged students have higher per pupil expenditures (this sheet is not available for LEAs with just one school). Subsequent dashboards dig deeper on how each LEA allocated monetary resources and staff between schools and how it relates to student demographics, teacher characteristics, source of funds, and assessment outcomes.

The source of all the data in this dashboard is the Uniform Chart of Accounts (UCOA), RIDE Report Cards, and End of Year Enrollment files.





Bar graphs represent the per pupil expenditures in 2022-2023 and the circles represent the percentage of students in the school for the demographic group selected. This chart displays the per pupil of expendiutes reported in district level locations (e.i. Central Office) for reference. The expectation is for LEAs to allocate the resources in a way that matches the needs of the students. That is, schools with higher percentages of multilingual, differently abled, and economically disadvantaged students should generally have higher expenditures to provide opportunities to these students. The graph also displays other school characteristics that can impact per pupil expenditures such as enrollment (ADM), and grade span. Use the dropdown to select the demographic characteristic to display. At risk is defined as students that are either economically disadvantaged, multilingual, or differently abled. The bar graph represents the **school per pupil expenditures** and the shades identify the source of funds. Circle colors present the percentage of students in the school of the demographic characteristic selected. Hover over the bars to diplay details about the type of federal funds expended. Use the dropdowns to select the student demographic to display and filter state/local and federal funds. Federal funds are expected to be distributed more progressively with schools with higher percentage of at risk students receiving more funds. This is particularly true for Title I and economically disadvantaged students, Title III and multilingual learners, and IDEA and differently abled students. The blue shades of the bar graphs represent the percentage of economically disadvantaged students in the school. Use the dropdown to select between the following categories of teacher qualifications: Percentage of inexperienced teachers (0 to 3 prior public school experience), percentage of teachers working out of field (teachers without appropriate certificate for assignment), or percentage of teachers using an emergency or preliminary certificaticate. Look for schools with higher percentage of teachers that are inexperienced, out of field, or using an emergency/preliminary certificate and explore if there is any association with the percentage of economically disadvantaged students. Users can also drill down to detailed categories by clicking th + on the table. Hovering over the table displays the actual 2021-22 actual expenditures and historical per pupil of the category. Use the dropdown to select the UCOA segment to display.
